



Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH)

REACH is a European Community Regulation for chemicals and their safe use (EC 1907/2006); it deals with the registration, evaluation, authorization, and restriction of chemical substances. The law entered into force on June 1, 2007 with the most current annex added on January 10, 2018. The aim of REACH is to improve the protection of human health and the environment through a better and earlier identification of the intrinsic properties of chemical substances.
